Your grade in Math 12 is also cumulative so there is no averaging between term 1 and term 2. The mark a student has at the end of term 1 is the mark that student carries over to begin term 2. There are six unit tests and then eight review tests at the end of the year and these 14 tests make up your entire class grade for this course.

Provincial Exam = 40%

A two-and-a-half hour exam at the end of the semester accounts for almost half of your grade. The eight review tests will closely resemble this exam so there will be many chances for mastery of the material.
